What issues does the resource aim to address?	<p>“Tiakina, our Kaitiaki Relationship Framework, is a set of tools, guidelines, agreements and policies that will help Ngā Taonga develop more meaningful relationships with iwi Māori. It also brings practical applications of whakaaro Māori to Taonga Māori across all areas of archival practice.</p> <p>We created the Kaitiaki Relationship Framework to build more collaboration and trust, and to allow Māori to exercise mana and control over how their taonga are made available. It makes space for Kaitiaki to speak on behalf of their collections. The framework seeks to enable Kaitiaki to maintain an enduring relationship with their Taonga Māori, to ensure culturally appropriate use and to protect it from any derogatory or offensive public use.”</p> <p>(About)</p>

24. Framework structure	<p>“The framework is named Tiakina. Tiakina is the passive form of the verb tiaki meaning to protect or care for. We recognise the role and obligation of Kaitiaki to ‘Tiakina ngā taonga’ or care and protect that which is treasured.</p> <p>Each of the five letters of T-I-A-K-I in the framework refers to five aspects of Ngā Taonga as Kaipupuri, and Kaitiaki of Taonga Māori.</p> <p>The word ‘tiaki’ reminds us to care, to guard, and to protect the Taonga Māori. Both the word ‘tiaki’ and the individual parts of T-I-A-K-I serve an intentional purpose to remind all Ngā Taonga staff to think expansively and insightfully about why, how, when, and where Kaitiaki can access and reconnect with the images and voices of their tūpuna and exercise their kaitiakitanga responsibilities to guard and protect their Taonga and its Mātauranga Māori.” (p.3 of ‘Short Summary of Kaitiaki’)</p> <p>“Ngā Taonga Sound & Vision is a bicultural organisation that operates in accordance with the principles of Te Tiriti o Waitangi/The Treaty of Waitangi. In the spirit of partnership, protection and co-operation, Ngā Taonga acknowledges Kaitiaki rights to speak for their Taonga Māori.</p> <p>Our relationship with Kaitiaki is based on the following principles:</p> <p>Mana Taonga</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • We acknowledge the mana of Taonga Māori, that it has mauri and living Kaitiaki and is an expression of Mātauranga Māori that invokes ancestral connections. • We work with Kaitiaki to enhance the mana of the taonga by providing opportunities for Kaitiaki whānau,
