Policy coherence is important for supporting a wide range of SDG targets, and the effective implementation of the overall SDG agenda to avoid trade-offs, which helps foster effective, accountable and transparent institutions (SDG 16.6) and policies for sustainable development (SDG 16.B). These are essential as a foundation of a wide range of activities in collections-based institutions.
