Considering Indigenous peoples' rights as part of tourism activities can support SDG 8.9 (sustainable tourism).

Ensuring Indigenous perspectives are accommodated in education supports SDG 4.5. A strong focus is around Education for Sustainable Development (4.7), which acknowledges the importance of cultural diversity in sustainable development. The resource is also heavily focused on strengthening efforts to project both cultural and natural heritage (SDG 11.4).
