34. Comments on SDG linkages	This open-access publication is a very useful reference for professionals and staff whose libraries and institutions house East Asian collections. The journal covers a range of topics including both technical and non-technical aspects in librarianship. For example, the most recent issue, published in 2023, includes articles about digital humanities, diversity and inclusion and rare book care training. Even though no UN SDGs are specifically mentioned in the publication, this resource generally (may vary according to article or report themes) helps users address SDG targets 4.7 (appreciation of cultural diversity through East Asian library collections), 10.2 (empower East Asian professionals in the field and professionals whose works focus on East Asian collections and promote inclusion of all) 11.4 (safeguard East Asian library collections), 16.10 (ensure public access to the journal contents), 17.6 (diversity of north-south and south-south East Asian collections-related cooperation), and 17.16 (global partnerships sharing expertise and knowledge on East Asian collections in libraries worldwide).
