	<p>Media, the Federal Foreign Office Minister of State for International Cultural Policy, the Cultural Affairs Ministers of the Länder and the municipal umbrella organisations released their Framework Principles for Dealing with Collections from Colonial Contexts, in which human remains were explicitly mentioned. As new insights had had time to mature and new questions had arisen, the time had come to provide museums and collections with a revised set of guidelines for the care of human remains.” (p. 5)</p> <p>“The <i>Guidelines</i> were revised by a newly formed interdisciplinary Working Group of the German Museums Association consisting of ethnologists, archaeologists, anthropologists, medical historians, cultural experts, conservators, legal experts and ethicists.” (p. 9)</p> <p>“A fundamental role is also played by the perspectives of the countries and communities of origin, which highlight the special significance of these sensitive collections. For this reason, the <i>Guidelines</i> include contributions by international experts from Australia, Hawai’i and Namibia, which explain the significance of the deceased in various communities of origin.” (p. 8)</p>
